The construction began in 1880 and was completed by a convict labour force from the newly-constructedBorstal prison. The work was supervised by the Royal Engineers. This Fort is constructed in the shape of a six-sided arrow head, each flank was protected by machine gunsin the counterscarp galleries. The Fort would have been home to approximately 400 men and women, so does this explain why this location is so active? There are areas of theFort that are so scary that the security guard and guests will not even enter. Eerie footsteps can be heard walking towards you but nobody ever arrives.
